Family Festival

Saturday, September 9 • 10 am to 4 pm

Complimentary trolley service will connect all Family Festival locations and the Native American Outdoor Art Fair. Admission is free.

Omaha Children's Museum

Families can participate in science experiments and art projects related to the Expedition. Enjoy lively entertainment by singer Bobby Norfolk presenting "Through the Eyes of York." The Many Moccasins Native American dance troupe and Greenblatt & Seay will entertain visitors with traditional and original music performances featuring instruments from the 1800s.

Omaha Public Library - W. Dale Clark Library

Learn from Matthew "Sitting Bear" Jones as he explains the meetings of Lewis and Clark with the first Native Americans they encountered, the Otoe-Missouria. Dale Clark, portraying a fictional member of the Corps of Discovery will captivate audiences with mementos from the trip.

National Historic Trail**

Be surrounded by history when you visit a Corps of Discovery encampment with re-enactors from the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers. Kids can create their own Native American musical instruments inside the National Park Service headquarters.

Joslyn Art Museum

Explore Art of the American West and experience a hands-on exhibit of Native American buffalo hides, bear claws, porcupine quills and other items. Kids can create their own maps and a per fleche carrying bag. Living history performances by NAMMY-Award winner Arvel Bird and Daniel Slosberg as the fiddle player, Pierre Cruzatte.

Durham Western Heritage Museum

Discover a model keelboat and educational panels at the grand opening of the new, permanent Lewis and Clark exhibit. Learn fascinating facts from Dr. Gary Moulton, nationally renowned Lewis and Clark scholar and co-editor of the Lewis and Clark journals, during his three lectures.

Lauritzen Gardens, Omaha's Botanical Center

Guests are welcome to come inside the visitors center to try their hand at creating ink drawings as Lewis and Clark did in their journals. Nationally renowned speaker Rick Magee will give lectures on the importance of Lewis and Clark's gathering of plant specimens.

Native American Outdoor Art Fair and Gallery Exhibit

Nebraska Arts Council • 10 am to 4 pm

Shop the Native American Outdoor Art Fair where artists will offer unique, handmade artwork from a variety of media. Artists will also provide demonstrations of traditional crafts including beadwork, leatherwork, sculpture and painting. In addition, an exhibit showcasing the works of Native American artists will be on display in the Nebraska Arts Council's Showcase Gallery. The exhibiting artists are members of the four federally-recognized tribes of Nebraska as well as members of the Otoe-Missouria Tribe. The Native American Art Exhibit runs through September 22. Omaha Symphony Concert and Fireworks

Lewis & Clark Landing • 8 pm

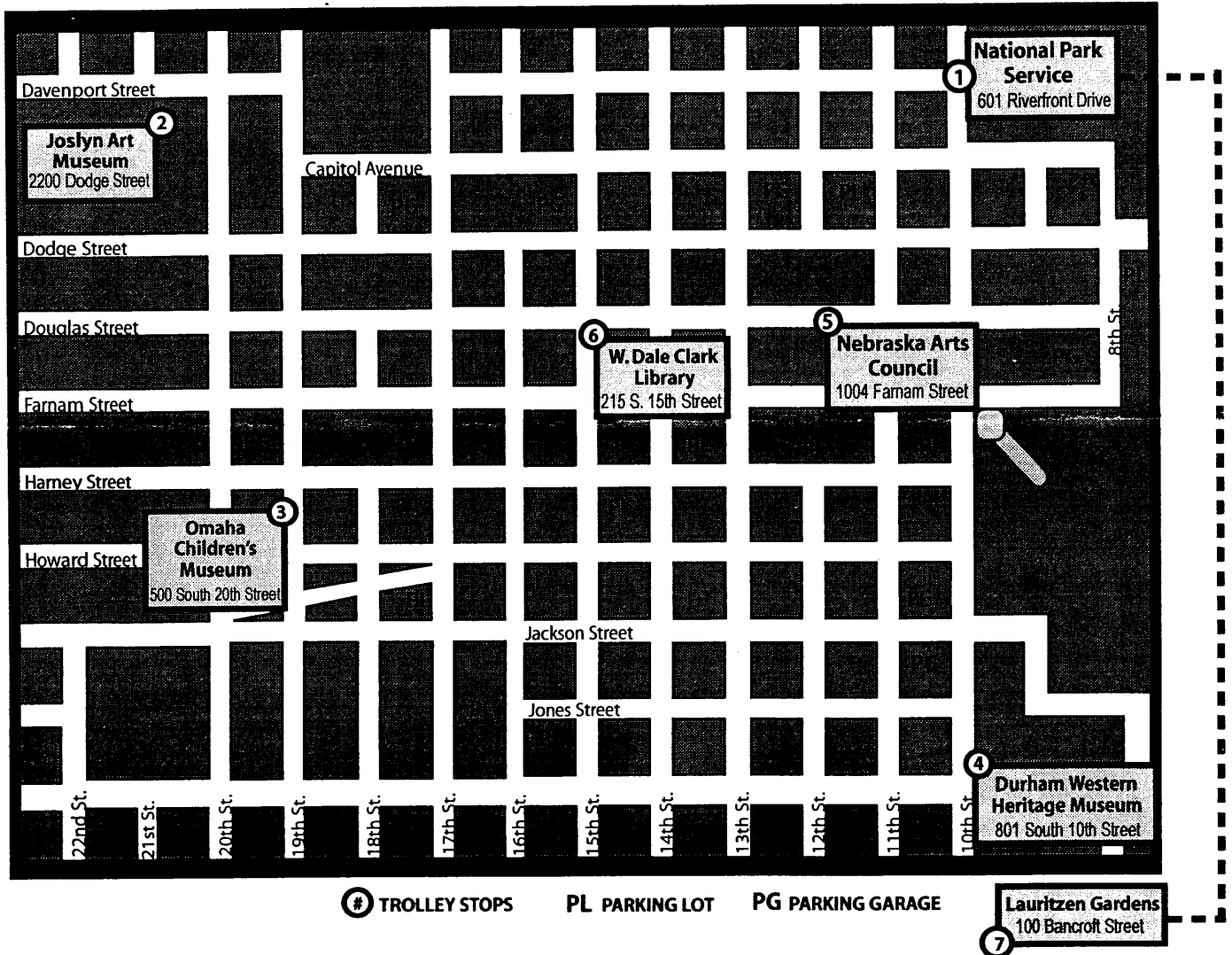

The grand finale is a colorful fireworks show over the Missouri River and a rousing performance of "The Stars and Stripes Forever" to mark the conclusion in Omaha of the Lewis and Clark Bicentennial Commemoration.
